Eligibility Change for Construction Workers

The Trustees have made the following temporary change to the eligibility provisions provided in the Electrical Insurance Trustees Health & Welfare Plan for Construction Workers (the "Health and Welfare Plan") as described in the Health Care Booklet for Participants in the Construction Plan dated as of January 1, 2008.

If you lost eligibility under the Health and Welfare Plan for more than 52 weeks, the number of contributed hours needed to re-establish eligibility is temporarily lowered to 400 hours in a six- consecutive month period. Prior to this temporary change, the Plan required you to earn 600 contributed hours in a six-consecutive month period. This temporary change begins with contributed hours for the May 2012 work month and will remain in effect for one year only (through the April 2013 work month). After the April 2013 work month, if you have not re-established eligibility under the Plan, you will be required to meet the 600 contributed hour requirement.

Please note that if you lost (or lose) eligibility for less than a 52-week period, those rules did not change. You may re-establish eligibility and reinstate coverage under the Plan if you earn 300 contributed hours in three consecutive months.
